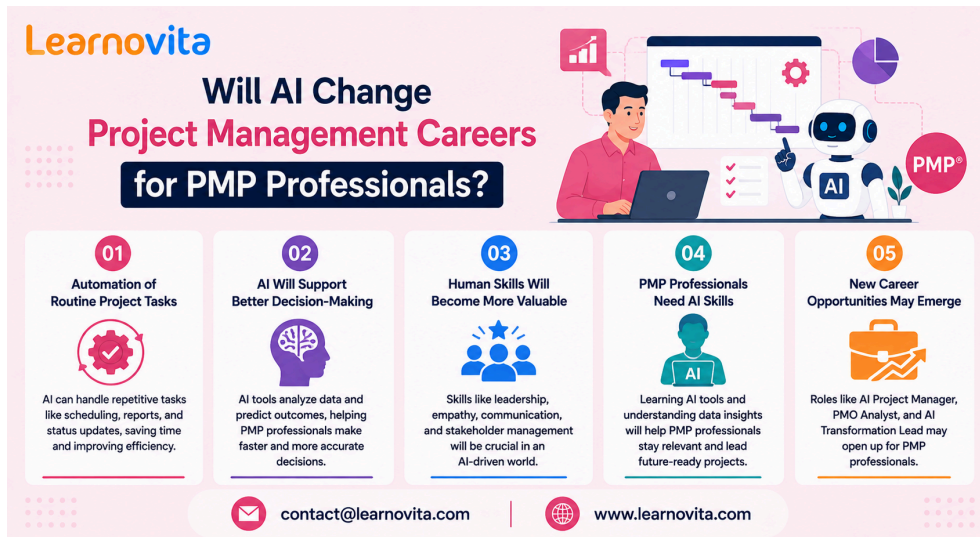


1. Automation of Routine Project Tasks
